Welcome to the 2019 Real Wine Fair!

The Real Wine Fair is an independent festival of natural growers and winemakers, comprising those who work organically and/or biodynamically and with few or zero interventions in the winery. That said, real wine is relative rather than an absolute or precise term and embodies a certain spirit of endeavour in the vineyard and the winery. We understand that each grower has a highly specific approach; we should celebrate those differences.

Real wines tend to be made in small quantities by artisan or independent producers who work without chemicals (which means no artificial fertilisers, pesticides or herbicides) in low yielding vineyards and then vinify without artificial yeasts or enzymes, or recourse to acidification or other adjustments. Many are made with only tiny amounts of added sulphur and some with none at all. 'Nowt taken out and nowt put in', as the saying goes. The motivation is to rediscover the true flavour of wine by capturing the sense of place (terroir) and the very nature of the vintage.

These wines are individual, hand-crafted, thrilling and unpredictable. They remind us that wine can be a living thing rather than a denatured product and that less intervention means more real flavour.

This booklet contains details of hundreds of wines from many countries around the world presented by growers and winemakers who have stories to tell.

We hope you enjoy these wines as much as we do. And if you want to buy a bottle or several, or order something you have tasted at the fair there is a pop-up shop by the entrance of the main hall!

And wine is only part of the Fair. Check out the artisan food tables and grab a bite from one of the stalls or attend one of the fascinating Real Wine seminars and masterclasses.

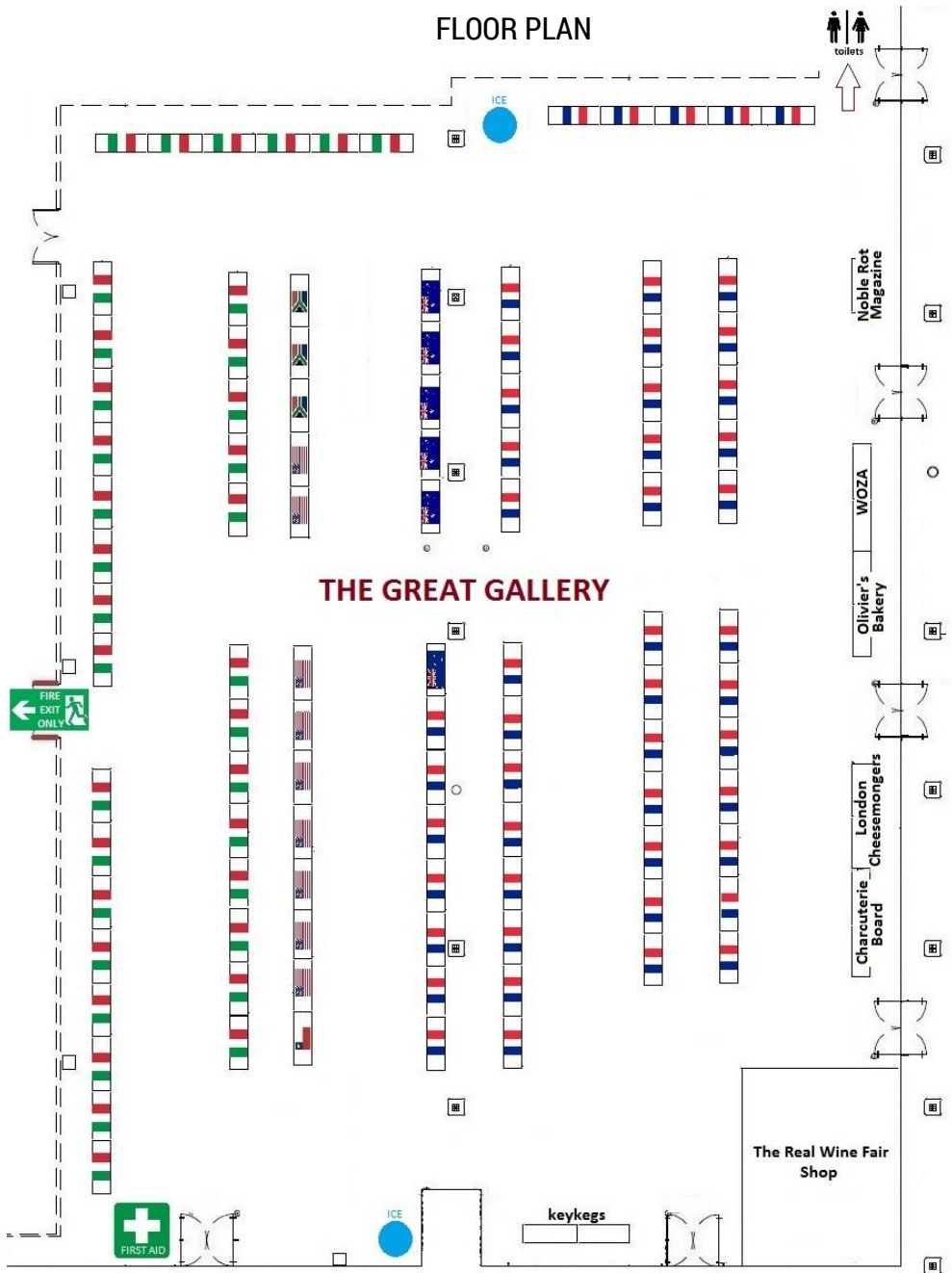

THE GREAT GALLERY FLOOR PLAN

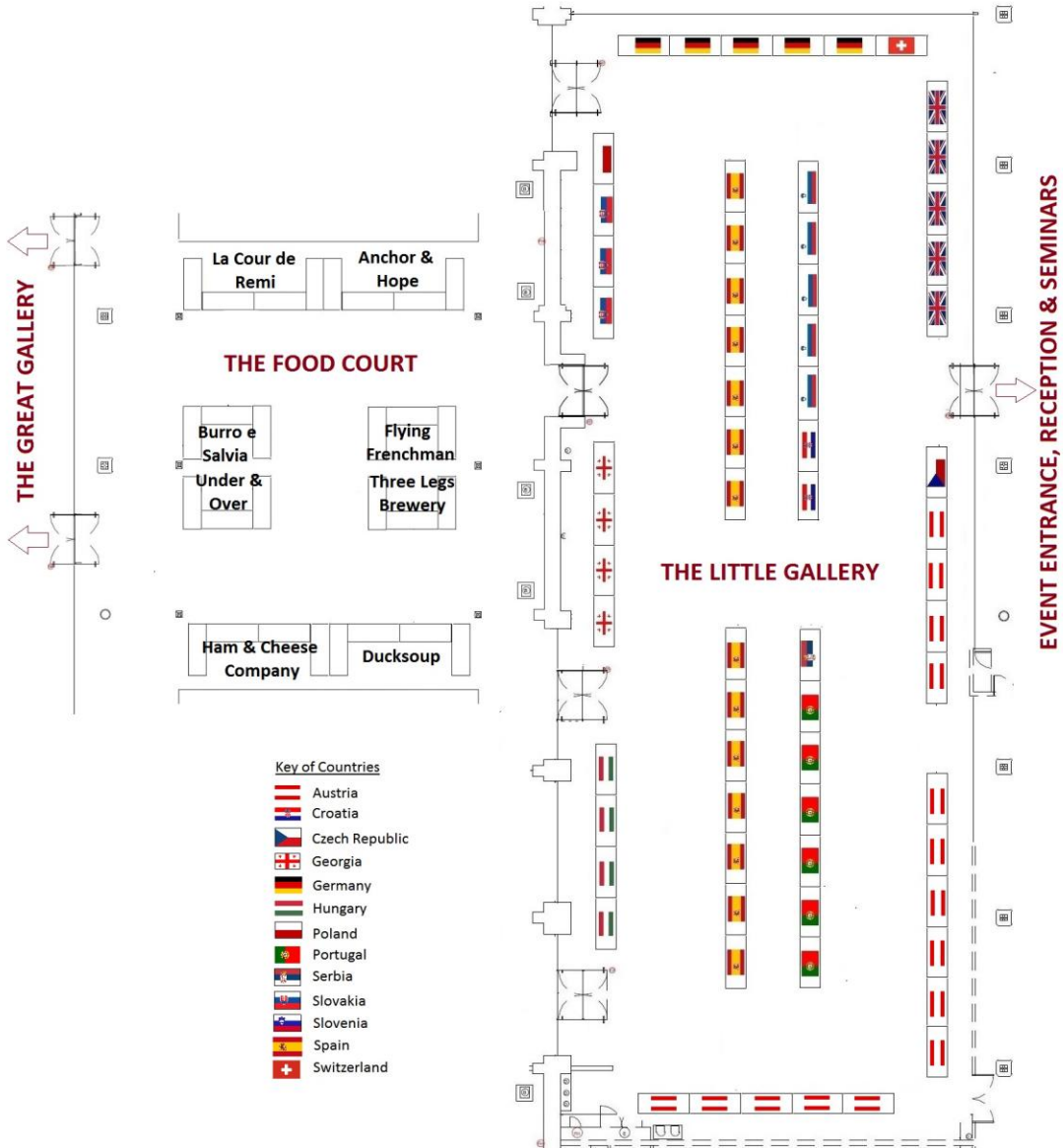

These are the people who, along with the winemakers, have helped make the fair happen. If you fancy finding out more about what they do, check out their websites.

Les Caves de Pyrène - www.lescaves.co.uk - Les Caves de Pyrène, a wine importer, distributor and agent, was founded in 1988. Initially it was four people, a battered van and a small handful of wines from South West France. Despite our subsequent growth, our philosophy remains the same as it did from the beginning: to source the best quality wines directly from the grower and the vineyard; that these wines should reflect where they come from (the expression of “terroir”); that these wines should be sustainable, with low intervention and preferably organic or biodynamic; that we not only sell these wines with energy and passion but provide the service that helps our customers to connect more effectively with their customers.

Modal Wines - www.modalwines.com - is an importer of small-batch, distinctive wines, grown and produced with love and respect, regardless of location. Modal scales in music sit outside the more common and ordinary major and minor scales – out of the many parallels between music and wine, this particular concept beautifully illustrates the aim at Modal Wines: to source unique wines with the right mix of edge, character, balance, and drinkability – at times surprising, but always thoroughly enjoyable. A deep-rooted respect for nature unites all the producers in their portfolio, the onus being on wines made with as little interference in the vineyards and cellar as possible.

Newcomer Wines - www.newcomerwines.com - is an importer and distributor that specialises in minimal intervention wines from Austria. Their growers are dedicated to making honest, terroir-driven wines from local varieties. Recently Newcomer Wines has also started working with a handful of forward-thinking artisanal winemakers from the neighbouring countries of Germany, Hungary and the Czech Republic.

Portuguese Story - www.portuguesestory.com - We are traders and story tellers who want to give a Portuguese narrative to the world, to change people's perceptions and to bring the diversity and uniqueness of Portugal out. One of the ways we want people to engage is through the local and unique and characteristic quality products. Wine can be a strong ambassador of native character and for Portugal this could not be truer. Our vision is that by bringing wine to other markets we will help and encourage people to discover and value Portugal, and help Portugal find its true respected place in the modern world.

Roland Wines - www.rolandwines.co.uk - is an importer sourcing wine from a niche market with a clear mission. Find the heroes of Central and Eastern Europe - those producers - who are willing to conquer their land by growing grapes in a sustainable manner, respecting nature. Our vintners produce their own wines with the least intervention possible to make it a true reflection of their origin. We are proud to present what we believe Hungary, Slovakia, Slovenia and Croatia have to offer.

Totem Wines - www.totemwines.co.uk - Totem Wines work with growers from the undervalued parts of France and Italy and also a few who are making their voice heard within the traditional regions of wine production. Many of these are eschewing their classification and this is often where the exciting winemaking is found. Nevertheless, their wines could not be more typical, even if they are unconventional. The list is small and producer-led. Most work organically and some with the lunar calendar at hand; but all work hard in the vineyard to ensure, above all, healthy grapes, so there's little need for more in the cellar...

Under the Bonnet - www.winesutb.com - was set up in January 2015 by two friends and fellow restaurateurs (Basile & Alex), to buy the kind of natural wines that they themselves like to drink in their favourite bars, restaurants and at home. These are wines from places close to their hearts; around Nantes, Angers and Saumur in the west of the Loire valley. The growers they work with operate simply, respecting their natural environment. To Basile and Alex, the people behind these bottles are just as important as the grapes themselves.

Indigo Wine - www.indigowine.com - is an importer and agent of unique and artisanal wines from around the world. They are proud to distribute these wines to the UK's best restaurants and independent retailers. They are best known for sourcing fresh and balanced wines from Spain, most notably from producers in lesser-known regions, who work with indigenous varieties. Over the years their portfolio has extended to include some real gems from Portugal, Austria, Italy, Australia, South Africa, Chile and beyond. They work hard to find talented growers who are committed to making real, honest and above all delicious wines.

The Real Wine Shop is located by the entrance of the Great Gallery. It will be selling a selection of wines to take away by the bottle during fair days and will be able to process larger orders for later delivery.

To allow visitors to make the most of their experience at the fair, all orders placed in The Real Wine Fair Shop including those to retail customers, will be processed at trade price.

EVENTS & SEMINARS

There will be a series of talks given by wine growers during the two days of the fair, details of which are given below. *Places can be reserved on arrival at the fair, at the main event reception.*

Sunday 12th May

12.00 – 12.45 pm – “Retasting wine: How we can become more informed drinkers.” **Heidi Nam Knudsen & Jon Passmore**, founders of **A Thousand Decisions**, an alternative course for wine education focusing on vineyard practices and winemaking techniques. The curriculum has been written in conjunction with winemakers to provide insights into what it takes to make distinctive and high-quality wines. Heidi and Jon will be discussing subjective versus objective taste, and how our choices as consumers can help to change the wine world.

1.15 – 2.00 pm – “Portugal’s Quiet Wine Revolution”. Ines Salpico hosts an expert panel, featuring Jamie Goode; Vasco Croft (Aphros); Pedro Marques (Vale da Capucha) and Luis Mota Capitaio.

2.30-3.30 pm – “Brave Orange New World” ~ **Simon Woolf**, author of *Amber Revolution: How The World Learned To Love Orange Wine*, the first book on this subject, will be hosting a masterclass tasting of amber wines from the New World, featuring examples from Evan Lewandowski, Beckham Estate, La Garagista and Intellego Wines.

4.00-5.00 pm – “The German Natural Wine Scene” - **Alex Thorp** of Under The Bonnet will compere a “German Growers’ Masterclass”. German natural wines are beginning to capture the hearts and minds of many a sommelier and independent retailer. **Michael Völker** (2Naturkinder), **Daniel Brand** (Weingut Brand) and **Daniel Schmitt** will reflect on their personal experiences and give an overview of the current German natural wine scene.

Monday 13th May

12.00 pm onwards – **BYO Podcast at The Real Wine Fair** - BYO will be broadcasting from the fair and interviewing a host of growers and natural wine luminaries. 'Bring Your Own' is a podcast and web series about wine and the people who make it, made by people who drink it. Host Derek Morrison will be inviting guests to share their own bottles that have a special meaning for them.

Milan Nestarec is a young grower based in the Moravia region of the Czech Republic where his father planted 8 hectares of vines in 2001. Milan works with a host of varieties including Riesling, Neuburger, Welschriesling, Pinot Noir and the lesser known Hibernál. The yield is kept low in the vineyards and the focus is always on quality and expressing the full potential of each variety. Milan is a member of the 'Autentisté' group - a community of winemakers making authentic wines that strive to express the true character of the land. No herbicides are used in his vineyards and the vines are worked strictly organically. Milan also vinifies everything with indigenous yeasts and bottles without fining or filtration.

All grapes are grown in Kamptal using organic processes and they add no sugar, yeast or sulphur.

Winemakers Alwin and Stefanie work organically on the vines. Inheriting the family's historic winery, where for generations they produced prominent and successful vintages, today the estate is driven by the fresh ideas of this inspired couple. Having travelled across New Zealand and Australia where they gathered considerable experience, they later worked as interns in France. Taking their combined knowledge of the Old and New World, today they focus on producing healthy, organic grapes. They work with indigenous yeasts and ambient temperature, the malolactic starting on the skins and finishing naturally in the barrels with only 10mg/litre total sulphur added and only at bottling.

This family-owned winery is located in the Kamptal Valley region of Austria. The 10-ha estate is made up of mainly old and well adapted vines of Grüner Veltliner, Riesling and Zweigelt. All wines are fermented spontaneously, unfiltered and minimal sulphur is added to them prior to bottling.

MG SOL, Michael Gindl, Weinviertel

Michael Gindl took over the family winery in the village of Hohenruppersdorf when he was just 20 years old. He changed the name of the estate to 'MG Sol' after Hohenruppersdorf's prized 'Sol' vineyard - a parcel that dates back to the 14th century. Michael also started to cultivate his 10 hectares of vines biodynamically, aiming to return to the more traditional winemaking methods of his grandfather. To this day, he works as naturally as he can both in the vineyards and the cellar. Michael's vinification style is also unusual for the region: his wines are all spontaneously fermented, aged on the lees for prolonged periods of time, and bottled without filtration. Some of his grapes are also kept on the skins for several months before pressing, producing powerful and complex wines.

Weingut Andreas Tscheppe, Sudsteirerland

Andreas and Elisabeth Tscheppe started their vineyard back in 2006. The vineyards lie on terraces and are cultivated biodynamically; each plant has its place and they try to take every living thing into consideration in the belief that the vitality and complexity of the soil are the basis for expressive wines. Grapes are harvested by hand and gently processed. Vinified in oak barrels the grape juice ferments spontaneously using the natural yeast found on the grapes. The wine is stored for up to two years in barrels and usually remains unfiltered and either sulphur-free or with only a small amount added.

Weingut Sepp Muster, Sudsteirerland

The Muster wine estate lies in the southern Austrian province of Styria. The estates history can be documented back to 1727 and is currently looked after by Sepp and Maria Muster. The steep sloping stony vineyards consisting of clay and silt sediment, called "Opok" in Southern Styria predominate and are cultivated biodynamically to achieve the highest level of vitality in the soil, the vine and the resulting wines. In the cellar wines are sensitively nurtured and given the possibility to mature as naturally as possible allowing them to develop their own individual characteristics of the soil and vintage. The aim being to produce long-aging, authentic and sensitive wines.

Since 2003 Christine and Franz Strohmeier have been working with great determination to produce completely natural wines without any additives or chemicals and almost exclusively sulphur free. Viniculture is sensitive and dedicated to promoting healthy soil structure; grass between the vines is only mowed twice a year, the use of tractors between the vines is minimised to prevent the soil from compacting and all forms of life are encouraged from the smallest cell to highly developed plants and animals. The primary principle throughout the process, from the vineyard to the drinking experience is "let all develop on its own" and thus rely on "how it really is".

Their vines are all located near the town of Jois in North Burgenland, and they have slowly grown from 1 hectare in 2015 to around 3 in 2017, their current release. The utmost care goes into every single part of the work from the vines to the cellar, where the absolute minimum is done to ensure as pure an expression of their grapes and their land as possible. Luka will be showing their whole range for the first time at the Real Wine Fair.

The Andert-Wein estate covers 4.5ha in the South of the Seewinkel, Burgenland in Austria. A family business, run by the Andert brothers; Erich and Michael, the estate has been certified biodynamic since 2003. The brothers love good wine and food and so throughout the vineyards herbs and vegetables grow bountifully alongside a variety of animals. The most important thing for them is that the natural wine processes are not disturbed in the cellar; fermentation is spontaneous and there is no temperature control, wines are left to develop naturally, gaining individuality and character.

Judith Beck's wines are in the best sense natural, genuine and above all authentic. Since 1976 the area under vine has increased from 5 to 15 ha and from 2007 the wines have been produced in accordance with biodynamic principles. The aim is to produce authentic wines with an individual aroma profile whilst at the same time maintaining healthy soils and vines. Always more discreet than loud, the wines are always worth a second look. In Judith Beck's own words: "International style can be produced by everyone, everywhere. My wines are my own, they are here and now and that is, for me, the most beautiful thing."

Claus Preisinger's winery is nestled in the village of Gols by Lake Neusiedlersee in Burgenland. Claus' priority has always been to produce wine that is pure, balanced, and expressive of his terroir. His winemaking methods are very much guided by instinct rather than set formula, and he is perpetually experimenting and evolving, making wine that is markedly different in style to the classic interpretations coming out of the region. Claus is deeply committed to working in harmony with nature, and has been certified biodynamic since 2009. Very little sulphur is added to his wines - Claus decides just before bottling if it is strictly necessary.

The Renner family have been cultivating vines in the village of Gols in Neusiedlersee since 1988. After spending a few years working abroad for producers such as Tom Lubbe of Matassa and Tom Shobrook, Susanne and Stefanie returned to the family winery and released their first vintage under the Rennersistas label in 2015. Stefanie and Susanne have parcels in some of the best vineyards by Lake Neusiedlersee including Altenberg, Schafleiten, Goldberg, Gebühl and Ungerberg. For the sisters, maintaining healthy vines and soil is paramount to producing honest, characterful wines. The 13 hectares of vines are farmed organically and the sisters work as naturally and meticulously as they can - both in the vineyards and in the cellar.

Weingut Christian Tschida, Illmitz, Burgenland

Christian Tschida cultivates 10 hectares of old vines in the Neusiedlersee region of Burgenland. Christian has a very hands-off approach in his vineyards, preferring to let nature take its course. His wild looking parcels are instantly recognisable - overgrown with covercrops that both preserve biodiversity in the vineyards and force the vines to bury their roots deep into the soils in search of nutrients. His wines are all foot stomped, spontaneously fermented and racked using gravity. He adds minimal amounts of sulphur to his wines.

Weingut Franz Weninger, Burgenland & Hungary

Viticulture is sensitive and dedicated to promoting healthy soil structure. Franz Weninger works towards encouraging the most natural and healthy soils for his vines to retain its natural plants and fauna, only mowing one of two times a year. He comes from a long line of growers and strives for the most organic practices where possible. Every second row in the vineyard is cut to allow enough space for an uninterrupted natural environment for indigenous insects and animals. Under the vines themselves the grass is cut simply with a scythe. The use of tractors is minimised to ensure that the soil is not compacted. All forms of life are encouraged from the smallest cell to highly developed plants and animals.

The wines ferment spontaneously with a relatively short skin maceration in order to preserve a pure expression of the fruit.

With Jean-Claude Lapalu's wine you can detect the fists behind the fruit. This is one of the new crew of sternly-made rock steady cru Beaujolais. Grapes are hand-picked and sorted, loaded by conveyor to avoid damage, and given neither SO2 nor cultured yeasts during the fermentation. During 8-10 days maceration a wooden grill is used to enhance extraction. The wine stays at least a half year on its fine lees gaining power and complexity. And yet the Brouillys are neither heavy nor clumsy and one could easily imagine them ageing ten to fifteen years. Croix des Rameaux, from beautifully exposed prime parcels of eighty-year- old vines and aged in three-to-five year old barriques after a long cuvaision, disports a wonderfully wild nose of leather, tar and red cherry and palate-punching dark fruits: stylistically it seems to straddle Burgundy and the Rhône.

Alice and Olivier planted their first vines towards the end of the 80s near the village of Courgis, north-west of Dijon. Today they have 10 ha of vineyards spread across 12 parcels of land in Courgis (Chablis AOC), Chitry and Saint-Bris-le-Vineux (Bourgogne AOC) and Beine and Fleys (Chablis PC) all of which are farmed organically. Grapes are picked by hand and only natural yeasts are used, no sulphur is added during fermentation and there is no chaptalisation, no fining or filtration. This biodiversity is an essential factor in biodynamic farming, which treats farms as self-contained, self-sufficient entities requiring little or no inputs from the outside. Stefano sadly passed away in 2018 but his family continue to make wines of incredible purity, using the same minimalist approach. Their belief is that the art of winemaking is to accompany the wine through its natural transformation process.

In 1435, the Maestranza de I Vigneri (Vine Grower Guild) was founded in Catania. The aim of the guild was to create a professional status for Etna's vigneroni and grape growers. Over 500 years later, Maestranza de I Vigneri works towards the recovery of Etna's time-honoured viticultural techniques and expertise, many of which has been impeded by current vineyard policies. For nearly fifteen years they have planted, reconstituted and cultivated more than 30 hectares of vineyards in eastern Sicily, 14 of which are on the volcano. Non-invasive tools and methods are used with the utmost respect for tradition. Work is carried out without rushing or pushing nature, with absolute respect for the people and the environment.

Grapes are sourced from 60 – 100 yr old bush vines farmed organically. The principal variety is Nerello Mascalese. The vineyards range from 760 – 900 metres in altitude. Soils are volcanic. Wines are made with minimal intervention, natural yeasts, no additives, no fining or filtering and little or no SO2 and fermented in a variety of vessels including Palmento, old barrels and even qvevri.

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The Azienda Agricola Caravaglio is located on the island of Salina, itself in the Aeolian archipelago in the Tyrrhenian Sea, north of Sicily. It is an extraordinary place with active volcanoes and the socio-ethno-anthropological charm of a culture that keeps the traditions linked to fishing and agriculture. Antonino's father produced red wine (Nerello Mascalese and Cappuccio, Perricone, Calabrese, Diavola ...) that was sold as bulk wine or in wooden barrels, intended as blending wine for the Italian and French market. Antonino inherited 2 hectares of vineyards and began his adventure in 1989, with the goal of developing the quality of the product and started farming organically. Today, Azienda Agricola Caravaglio has about 20 hectares, divided into many parcels, some of which are on the other islands of the Aeolian archipelago as well. All the wines are fermented with their own yeasts and made with minimal additions.
